### **PSUK 2023**

Dear Members, The new sailing season is virtually upon us.

The PSUK Sailing Offshore Championships will be held between Monday 9<sup>th</sup> October and Friday 13<sup>th</sup> October 2023 in the Solent.



The boats will be matched 37' yachts equipped with Asymmetric spinnakers chartered from Fairview Sailing. During the week Cowes will be used as a base with the Island Sailing Club managing the races.

Using the smaller Fairview boats with asymmetric spinnakers the sailing should be easier than the Sunsail boats were.

If you would like to be part of the Sussex crew please let me know before Monday 6<sup>th</sup> February 2023 so I know if we have sufficient to enter a team.

It is anticipated the cost to members will be £20 per day plus £1 per day for the lifeboat. This may increase due to increased charter costs but will be decided before you are asked to commit to the trip.

This is a great event to take part in with a little bit of competitiveness and an opportunity to meet and socialise with our colleagues from around the UK.

If you are a serving officer or member of staff and this is your first trip with SPOSC your first two days will be free.

#### **Commodores Report**

Dear Members,

Where has the year gone!

Well at last we have had a year of sailing. This year we had the Frostbite in April, the early summer cruise in May, the mid-summer cruise in July and the PSUK Offshore Nationals in October where we came second. In one of the races, we were the only boat to complete the course! This was largely due to Alwyn's skill and knowledge of the waters.

In 2023 we plan to run the same trips but may need to move the dates of some of them. If you are a skipper and would like to run one of these trips or an additional trip, please let me know.

I hope you have been entertained by the editions of Scuttlebutt put together so well by Terry Clothier and perusing the website which looks very professional and kept meticulously updated by Dusty Miller. I would like to give a very big thank you to both Terry and Dusty for all the hours they give up producing such excellent publications. Thank you also to all those who have contributed articles.

Dusty has created a new Sussex Police Offshore Sailing Club Facebook group, if you are on Facebook please join as you will get update notifications.

Hopefully you have all now had four COVID jabs and are staying COVID free or at least not being unwell with it. Due to COVID the committee imposed various restrictions for the club charters, including one person per cabin.

Unfortunately, that is just not sustainable. With increasing charter costs and decreasing funding we will have to return to two to a cabin for 2023.

The Sussex Police Sports Association carried out a survey of sporting sections, following the survey the SPSA decided sections needed to make greater efforts to involve serving officers and staff. Those sections made up predominantly of retired members would need to take a reduction in funding. The Sussex Police Offshore Sailing Club has been advised that we are one of the sections that will have a reduced grant in 2023. At this time, we do not know how much of a reduction it will be. I will continue to work closely with the SPSA to try to minimise any reduction in grant.

I do agree with the SPSA that more needs to be done to involve serving officers and staff, a club is not sustainable if we do not gain new younger members. Due to being a member of SPOSC I have been involved with the SPSA and until COVID was giving the SPSA presentation to new recruits with Kevin COOMBES who runs the go kart section. The presentations stopped due to COVID, but we are resuming them on 11th January 2023. SPOSC did receive interest from several new recruits, but their first three years make it difficult for them to take part in our activities.

The SPOSC committee have agreed that new members who are serving officers and staff, will be offered their first two days of their first charter free.

Dependant on the next grant the SPOSC committee will decide on the daily rate for our trips. This may have to be applied after Frostbite.

If you are a serving officer or member of staff, please ensure you play your part by spreading the word of the great experiences and pleasure sailing provides, show people the website, tell them stories, point out they can learn and gain qualifications that will enable them to charter independently of SPOSC. We need new younger skippers to take the club forward.

Finally, your committee has worked hard in and out of meetings to maintain the club. I hope you will all join me in thanking them all for giving up their time for the club.

#### **SPOSC Trea surers Report 2022-23**

I have once again the pleasure of presenting the Treasurers Report to the Committee and all Members for our sailing season of 2022-23.

With the easing of Covid lockdowns and restrictions hopefully we have returned to some normality in the past year, and this has improved life for all of us.

Sailing wise this has allowed us to return to some form of original sailing arrangements for 2022 albeit we maintained single occupancy cabins. Although this gave confidence for members to resume sailing it did affect our chartering costs and the number of members, we could get affoat on one yacht.

2022 season allowed the Club to arrange 4 Charters, 3 being cruising and one PSUK Championships event. All these took place in the Solent and down to Poole.

Frostbite took place in April and although 2 yachts were originally booked to cater for the number of members who originally intended to go Covid, and other issues reduced the charter to one yacht.

May saw 6 members head to the West Country from the Hamble but were prevented from going further than Poole due to the weather. July saw another 6 members charter from the Hamble to Poole and back.

In October the Police Sailing Championships took place in the Solent. Despite ten forces initially expressing interest in the event on the day of the race only 5 boats crossed the start line. Four days of racing took place in the Solent with the Sussex entry attaining 2nd place overall. For several years now, with the agreement of SPSA, SPOSC has accrued a separate £5000 security fund to pay all our own refundable security deposits when chartering.

Rule 7 of the Club rules require the Committee at each AGM to 'set a cap' to limit the liability that each crew member may be liable for. SPOSC will then pay the balance of any damage up to the excess. The figure for 2023-4 season will remain unchanged at £100 per each member.

The Committee are continually seeking new ideas to encourage members and new members to start or resume sailing with the Club. For 2023 season the club will offer all new members a free two-day sail as an introduction to sailing with the Club.

Club finances are still 'buoyant' in as much we have monies remaining from this season which will enable us to secure deposits on yachts for the forthcoming 2023 Sailing calendar.

Sussex Chief Constable and the SPSA are reviewing the financial procedures and allocation of Section funds for 2023 and beyond. We have already been advised this may impact on the amount of funding we receive annually. If so, later in 2023 SPOSC Committee may have to review its financial position to consider any changes.

I encourage all members to support your SPOSC and the events it arranges on your behalf in the coming season. These Sailing activities allow us to maintain our grants from the SPSA. Also, if you have work colleagues who are interested in trying sailing, irrespective of their previous experiences or concerns, get them to come on a charter or speak with any Committee member regarding further details and events.

So, I wish the best of health to everyone and that you and your families stay safe and well.

Hopefully we can look forward to enjoying some really good sailing for 2023 with a convivial meal and few beers on board or ashore.

### SPDSC AGM

#### SPDSC (East) AGM Report

As you know, the East side of SPDSC has a Laser 2000 at Pevensey Bay Sailing Club. The boat is very good condition with a recent new set of sails, new launching trolley and new mast. The control lines and foils are also in good condition; however the boat would benefit from a new spinnaker halyard. The cover is tired but should last another season. The boat holds a prime spot in the boatyard which is chargeable at £,50 per year. There is £27 charge for the road trailer storage. Both of which have been paid for 2023.

In 2020 I took the Laser 2000 to Chichester for a week of sailing and camping with PBSC, if available, I may well do the same again this year. The estuaries around Bosham, Thorney Island, Dell Key are lovely places to sail Trying to sail against a rising tide, out to sea from Hayling Island sailing club is a real challenge, I highly recommend taking the boat there. In 2021 PCSO Paul Umney took the boat to Chichester Camp, also. Last year the boat was not used at the sailing camp but I used it number of times, taking out Police staff on PBSC Ice-Cream cruises and sail training. I also used the boat on the PBSC Open Day. Talking of open days, PBSC will be holding its open day at the beginning of May, possibly the King's Coronation bank holiday weekend. Do come along and visit the club, there will be a number of boats set up for taster sails.

Last season I offered a number of Police staff the opportunity to take refresher sailing trips, they had initially contacted me asking about the boat and its availability. We agreed dates we were both available but unfortunately bad weather or shift changes stopped that happening.

My offer remains open to take members of Sussex Police out for taster sailing sessions, or to refresh their skills before taking the boat out for themselves.

The boat is available for use by any Sussex Police officers and staff and retired members, who have completed their Level 1 & Level 2 and subscribe to the Sports and Social Club.

This year we have a new member Tony Mottram, who will no doubt be making good use of the boat when the season restarts.

I urge members to use the boats, they are a fantastic resource, ready and waiting a dip in the sea.

### SPDSC AGM

#### SPDSC (West) AGM Report.

Two boats remain at Lancing Sailing Club, the single handed Laser and also the Laser 2000. Overall the situation at Lancing is that there are currently only two SPDSC members actively sailing at Lancing both of which have their own boats and as a consequence both SPDSC boats do not get regular use. Lancing membership will be expected soon and boat storage will be £63 for the Laser and £91 for the 2000. Of note and for consideration LSC did show interest in buying the Laser 2000 should SPDSC consider selling. This was only an expression of interest and not taken any further.

Lancing SC remains a very competitive price for membership and club boats are available to members at minimal charge. Training is expected to continue but will be more focused on improving sailing standards as opposed to those people starting and with no sailing experience.

Both boats remain in overall good condition

The Laser 2000 was used twice, once at Lancing in preparation for use at the Police Nationals and then for the Police National Event at Chew Valley itself. The new sails remain in excellent condition and I have managed to store them rolled indoors at the sailing club. The cover remains serviceable (6/10) and the foils and ropes all good (7/10). The trolley overall is ok. However the axles which the wheels rotate have corroded badly. Previously the wheels were prevented from rotating by the corrosion which have since come away which now causes the wheels to "wobble" as the axle. Is no longer big enough for the trolley wheels. Ideally new axles could be welded to the frame of the trolley but I anticipate that the frame of rot trolley has corroded and will not take a weld.

The single handed Laser soldiers on, I used it on several occasions 2021 and 2022. However this won't be the case now I have a single handed boat of my own and I anticipate its use will be minimal moving forward. The repair completed at Bexhill remains solid. Since a replacement centreboard brake, bung and housing the boat is again watertight. The toes taps gave way and have been replaced and have been refitted with a system whereby you can adjust toe strap length whilst afloat. The new outhaul loop at the Cunningham has also made the rigging precess and use of the outhaul much better. The sail doesn't get any younger and is probably a 5/10 but still serviceable but with signs of wear and also some staining. The cover however has failed at the rear 1/4 and transom area. It was a cheap cover which initially shrank and then was not up to the strain when put over the boat. The boat currently holds a bottom rack so has a boat above so whilst not being used the cover is not urgent. If it loses its premium spot it will need a cover. The trolley is fine.
